# The California Collaborative on the Social and Emotional Foundations



for Early Learning (CA CSEFEL) connects early childhood programs with trainers and

coaches who are experts in the CA CSEFEL Teaching Pyramid Framework. This tiered approach of evidence-based practices promotes healthy social-emotional development in young children (birth to 5 years old). Preventatives strategies have been proven to reduce behaviors that can be disruptive in group settings. Teachers and administrators also learn intervention strategies that effectively support positive individual behaviors of young children in group care settings. CA CSEFEL trainers and coaches promote collaboration to enhance linkages with local agencies, allowing services and interventions to be successfully delivered to children and their families.
