What

Under the direction of the California Department of Social Services (CDSS),

Childcare and Development Division (CDD), the California Preschool Instructional Network (CPIN) is funded by the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF). CPIN provides support to administrators, teachers, early learning leaders, coaches, early care and education providers, and local education agencies (LEAs) of California's pre-kindergarten and transitional kindergarten children, including dual language learners and individuals with disabilities. CPIN was established in 2004.

Why

CPIN utilizes the California Preschool Learning Foundations, California Preschool

Curriculum Frameworks, and The Alignment of the California Preschool Learning Foundations with Key Early Education Resources to promote linkages between preschool and infant/toddler learning and development foundations, and TK–12 California State Standards. CPIN's professional learning sessions are part of California's Early Learning and Development System and are in alignment with the elements of the Quality Counts California (QCC) Rating Matrix. To effectively enhance program quality, CPIN professional learning deepens teachers understanding of the foundations and frameworks which supports the use of core tools and resources identified in the



QCC matrix. Over 70 professional learning topics are available to early childhood education teachers, coaches, administrators, TK teachers, migrant education school readiness staff, and others. Certificates are provided and count towards professional growth hours.

Who

Professional learning is facilitated by certified CPIN instructors who are highly

qualified and deeply committed to providing professional learning to enhance program quality. Instructors provide coaching, technical assistance, and support to a diverse group of stakeholders. They are engaged in ongoing professional learning by nationally recognized ECE researchers. CPIN instructors specialize in early childhood education to support inclusive and responsive practices for dual language learners and children with disabilities.

How

Through statewide and regional in-person and virtual communities of practice (CoPs)

and a series of professional learning experiences, CPIN instructors provide research-based teaching and learning strategies that are age and developmentally appropriate and highlight inclusive practices and support for ALL children. Instruction incorporates adult learning theories and is intentional, reflective, and interactive with hands-on learning and time for planning. CPIN provides models of teaching and learning practices that are developmentally appropriate for young learners, promotes promising practices in early learning, family engagement, and equity, and emphasizes a whole child approach.
